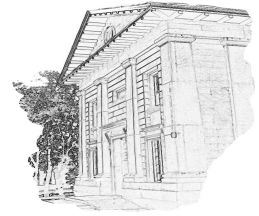

Baptism: The Priest and catechists of the parish met this week to discuss the preparation of the sacrament of Baptism in the parish. Fr Uche will work with the catechists from now on. Those who wish to have their baby baptised before Christmas will need to attend **both** days of the course – Sept 7th and 14th. Once you have filled in the form, which can be found at the back of church, and returned it to the parish office, you will automatically be allocated a place on the course. Forms must be returned by the weekend Aug 28th /29th.

First Holy Communion: Will anyone who wishes their child to receive First Holy Communion at All Saints or St Mary Crowned Glossop next year, please fill in a form from the back of church and return it to the parish office with a Catholic Baptismal certificate no later than the week ending Sept 18th /19th.

It would be helpful if the children were attending weekly Mass in preparation for this wonderful sacrament. We hope to begin the course in early October and finalise dates at a meeting with parents to be arranged once the forms are in.

Confirmation: The next Confirmation programme will begin after Christmas so now is the time to find your Baptismal certificate and make sure you are attending Mass regularly in preparation for receiving this wonderful sacrament in the coming year. Father John hopes to arrange a weekend for candidates at the Briars before they receive the Sacrament.

Marriage: Will anyone who wishes to marry at All Saints or St Mary Crowned, Glossop, in the next 12 months please fill in a form from the back of church and return it to the parish office as soon as possible. This will help the preparation for this wonderful sacrament to run more smoothly.

Sacrament of the Sick: Fr John is very happy to hear that the Eucharistic Ministers are assisting Fr Uche in visiting the sick and housebound in the parish, and they are delighted to have a priest visiting. Please continue to invite Fr Uche to administer the sacraments to the sick and housebound as it means so much to him and to them.

Parish Finances and Properties: Fr John is delighted to inform the people of the parish that the architect is making good progress in tendering for the renovation work which will be undertaken at All Saints. At the PPC meeting last Wednesday Bernard McMylor was appointed liaison representative to communicate with the architect on the further development of this project. We will give you more information after the holidays when we hope work will soon be starting. Finances from legacies given to the church will help in some way with the cost of this project. We do, however, have to keep as close eye on our expenditure because paying supply priests with no stipends coming in means that we are going over budget. In order to monitor the situation Fr John has set up a small finance committee from members of the PPC. Hopefully, by having Fr Uche here we will save the cost of supply priests. We pray that Mass stipends will increase in order to cover the priests' salaries and therefore balance the books.

Cardinal John Henry Newman (1801-1890) John Henry Newman was born in the City of London on 21st February 1801, the son of John Newman and Hemima Newman (nee Fourdrinier). He was the eldest of six children, three boys and three girls. As vicar of St. Mary's Oxford he exerted a profound spiritual influence on the Church of England. After joining the Catholic Church in 1845, he brought the oratory of St. Philip Neri to England, was the first Rector of the Catholic University in Dublin and was made Cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879. He died in Birmingham on 11th August 1890.

Then in His mercy may He give us a safe lodging, and a holy rest and peace at the last. Let the absolving words be said over me and the holy oil sign and seal me, and your own Body be my food, and your Blood my sprinkling; and let my sweet Mother, Mary, breathe on me, and my Angel whisper peace to me, and my glorious Saints smile upon me; that in them all and through them all, I may receive the gift of perseverance, and die, as I desire to live, in Your faith, in Your Church, in Your service, and in Your love, *Amen*.
