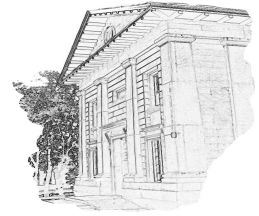

Sea Sunday: Next week is Sea Sunday, when the church remembers all those who live and work at sea. This year is also 'The Year of the Seafarer', and is a very important year for Apostleship of the Sea and seafarers. Seafarers are commonly recruited from poorer countries where wages are lower. Seafarers work in difficult and often dangerous conditions suffering from loneliness, spiritual deprivation and even exploitation as they transport the goods we use and consume every day.

The **Apostleship of the Sea (AOS)** is the official maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church in Great Britain. The Apostleship of the Sea reaches out to seafarers that visit our ports each year, offering pastoral and practical support and care. AOS is wholly dependent on voluntary donations to continue its work; it takes the love of Christ to seafarers in the name of the Church, recognising them as our brothers and sisters in need.

Sea Sunday is your chance to help AOS make a big difference to the lives of seafarers. Everything AOS does is on behalf of Britain's Catholic community, but it receives no statutory funding from either the Church or the government. The parish will take up a **second collection** on **Sea Sunday** for the work of AOS – so please give generously next Sunday, their ministry cannot continue without you.

First Holy Communion will be celebrated at All Saints next Sunday, July 11th, at 11.00am Mass. Will all parents & children arrive by **10.45am** at the latest so that final preparations can be made before the celebration.

The Sacraments: A new series of sacramental programmes will commence in September. As the resident priest in Glossop, Father Uche will work with the two sets of catechists to provide programmes throughout the year, and celebrate Baptism, Reconciliation, Holy Communion and Confirmation with his people. Anyone wishing for baptism for their children between September and Christmas should fill in a form from the back of church and send it in to the Parish Office at Royle House by July 31st 2010.

Visits to the Sick and Housebound: Could Eucharistic and school authorities make contact with Father Uche so that he can arrange visits to the sick and housebound, and to the schools of the parish.

The annual **Padley Pilgrimage** will take place on Sunday July 11th. Many people already take part and Father John would like to encourage as many as possible throughout the parish to come along. This is an inter-diocesan pilgrimage in honour of the Padley martyrs Blessed Robert Ludlam and Blessed Nicholas Garlick. The guest speaker is the Most Reverend Vincent Nicholls, Archbishop of Westminster. **You are asked to assemble at 3pm at Grindleford Station. Mass commences at 3.30 pm.** The reign of Elizabeth I was a time of religious persecution for English Catholics. In the early morning of July 12th 1588, Padley Manor, the residence of the Fitzherbert family, was raided. Two travelling priests and everyone at the hall were arrested. Garlick and Ludlam, along with another priest, Richard Simpson, were gruesomely executed in Derby within the fortnight.
